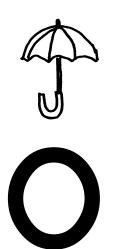

Instead of seeing the card and saying the sound, students hear the sound without seeing anything and write the letter or letter pattern. They should say the sound or sounds as they write it.
