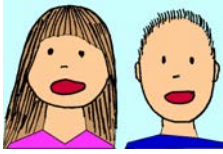


Sound City Reading Wall Charts

These charts show the phonics patterns taught in *Phonetic Words And Stories, Books 1-8*. They can also be used with *Basic Phonics Patterns, Books 1, 2, 3, 4, 5-6, 7-8* and with *Know The Phonetic Code, Volumes 1-3* because the books follow the same sequence.

Print the charts on 11 X 17 inch paper. Don't laminate the charts or the glare will make it difficult for students to see them. The charts can be arranged in a group on a wall. This provides a reference point when teaching and reviewing the patterns. If wall space does not allow all the charts to be displayed, the charts can be mounted on individual pieces of heavy weight 12 by 18 inch black construction paper and shown one at a time during the review period. This will create a black half-inch border around the charts. The black color works well because it allows the text and pictures on the charts to stand out.

Some charts are included in two or three different versions. Students working in the earlier books will use the charts with fewer patterns; those in the later books will use the charts with more patterns. The charts are labeled to show the books with which they will be used.

Don't put up all the charts at once. Each book uses a slightly different combination of charts. New phonics patterns are added to some of the charts as students move from one book to the next. Look at the instructions telling how to assemble the wall charts. The alphabet chart, beyond the alphabet chart, ending blends truck chart, and beginning blends truck chart will be used for all of the books. The other charts to use for each book are shown on the instructions. Look for the book you are ready to teach, and you will see the exact charts to use with that book.

Notice that when going from one book to the next, some of the charts stay the same, and some of the charts are modified to add new phonics patterns. When you add new charts that are different, you don't need to change the charts that stay the same.

For many of the charts, two versions are included. The first version shows phonics patterns with the related sound pictures. The second version shows the same patterns with key words and pictures. In general, practice the charts with the sound pictures first. Some students have difficulty hearing the particular part of a key word that has the new sound. When students become confident with the sound charts with sound pictures, try adding the charts with key words.

Some of the charts make more sense when using key words. The bossy r patterns are an example.

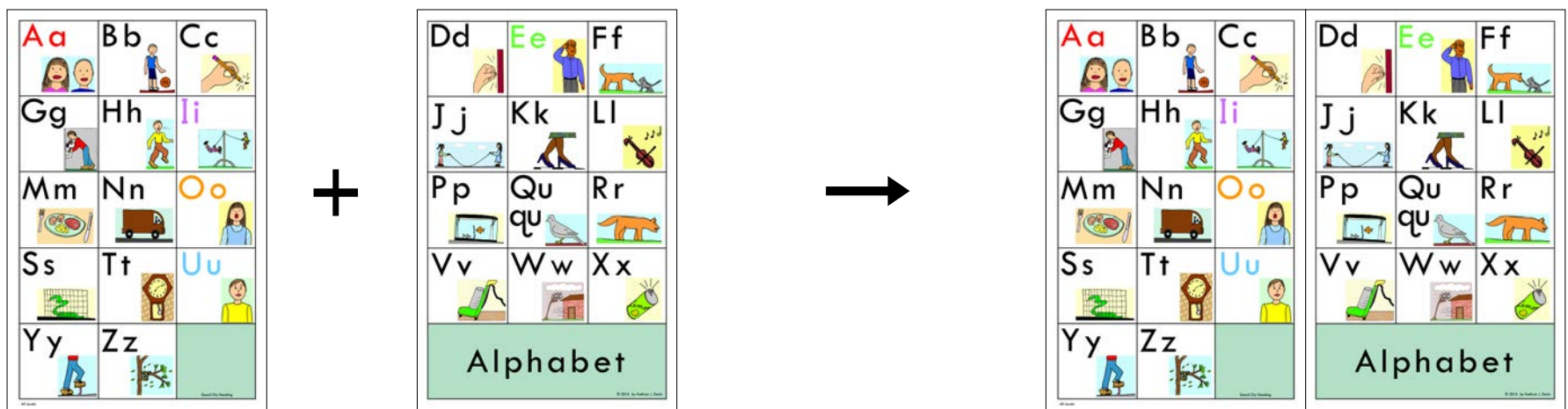
When placing charts on the wall, it is not necessary to put up both versions of the charts (sound pictures and key words). Choose the version for each chart that you prefer. The choice doesn't have to be the same for all of the charts.

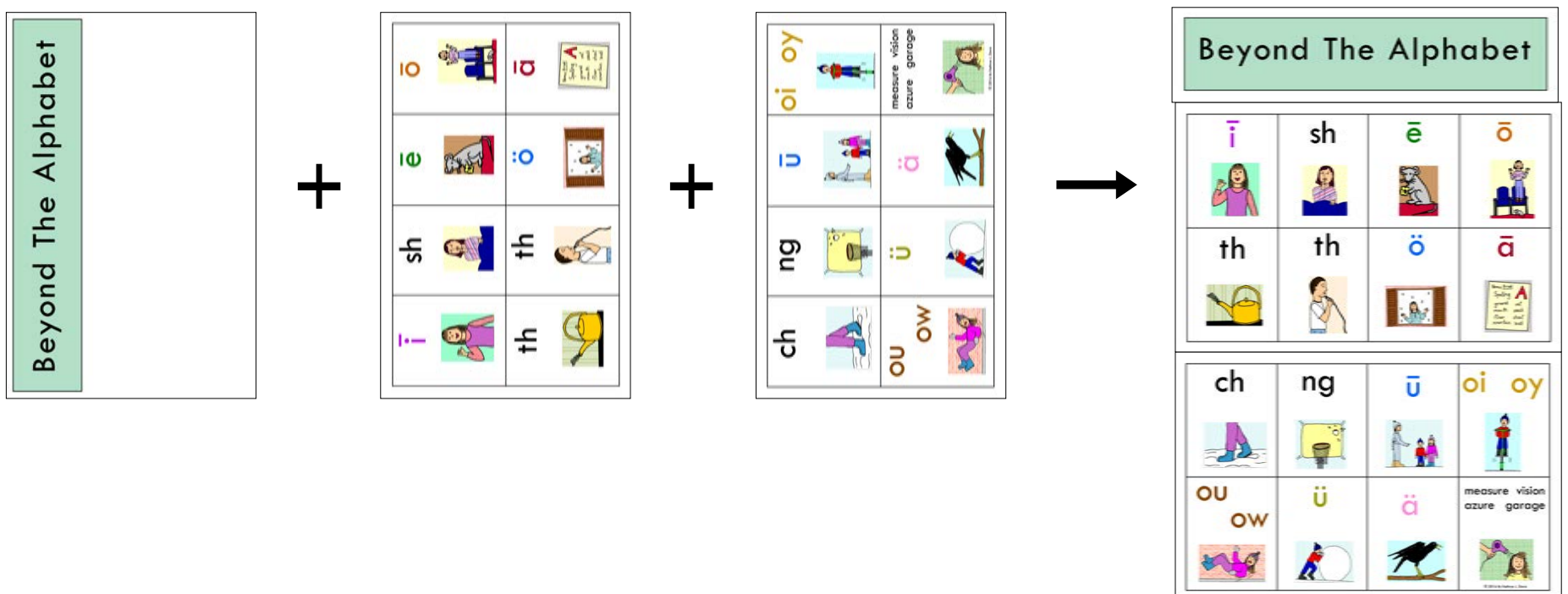
Alphabet Chart - Use With All Books 1-8

Beyond The Alphabet Chart (Sounds From Part 2 Of The Sound Story) - All Books 1-8

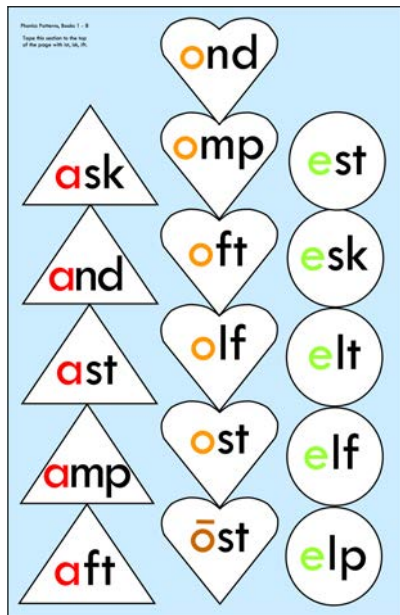
For the beyond the alphabet chart, cut off the white area below the Beyond The Alphabet heading. Tape the heading, top sheet, and bottom sheet together as shown.



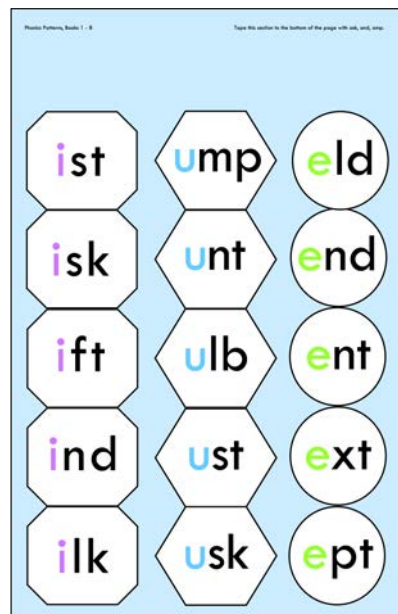

Ending Blend Truck Chart - Use With All Books 1-8

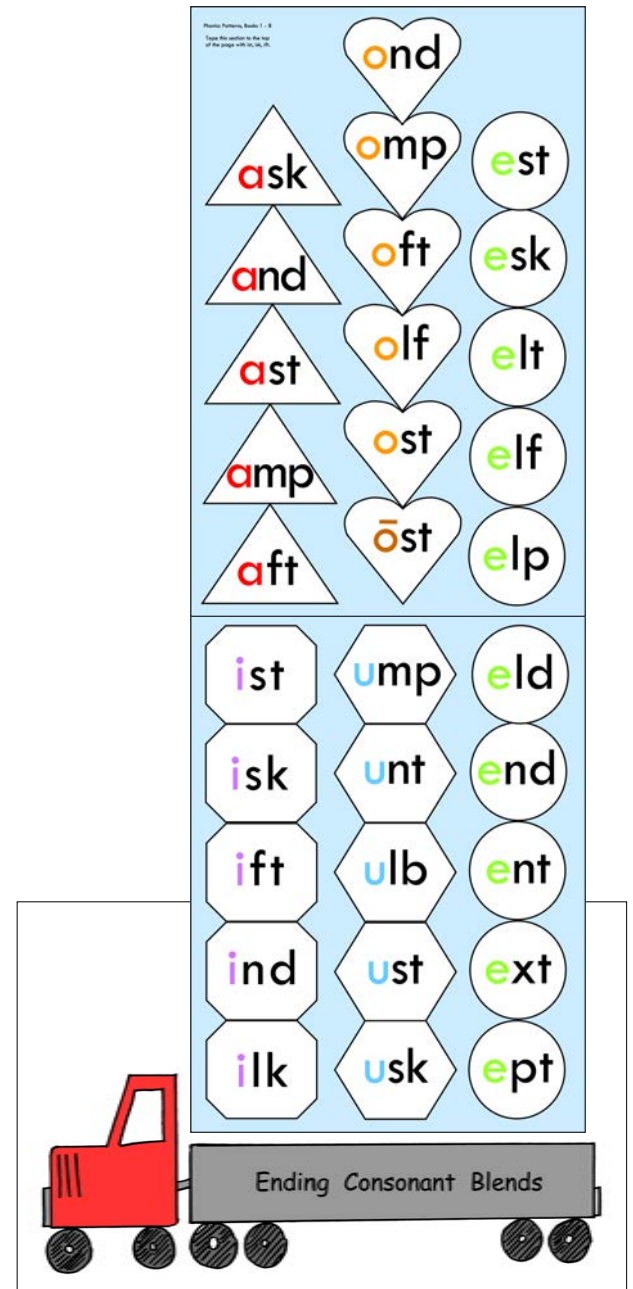
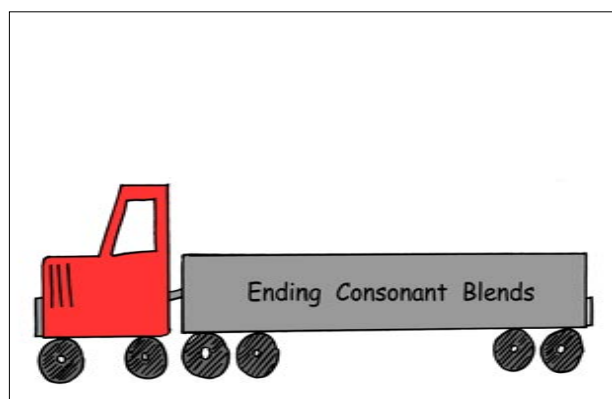
Trim off the white edge at the bottom of the page with aft, ost, and elp. Place it above the page with ist, ump, and eld at the top, arranging it so the stacks of ending blends are aligned. On the back, tape the pieces together. Place the ending blend pages on the truck page, so that the bottom edge sits on the truck bed. Tape together from the back.

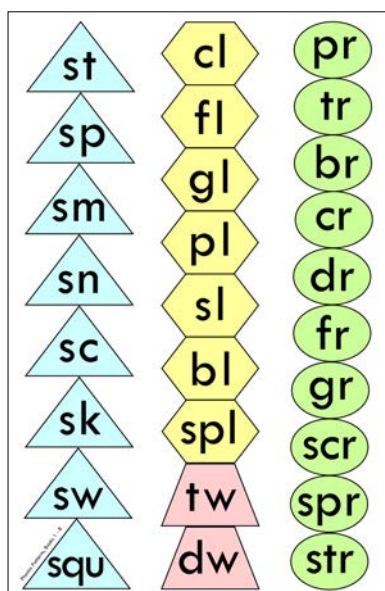


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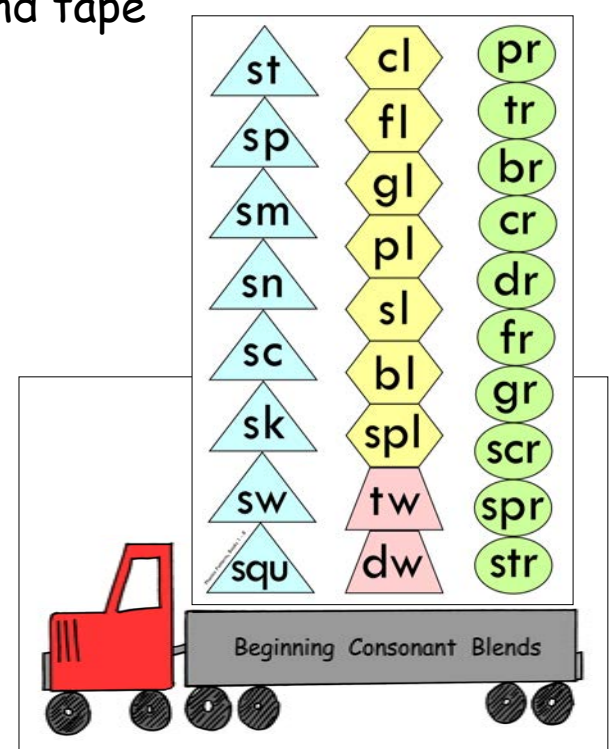
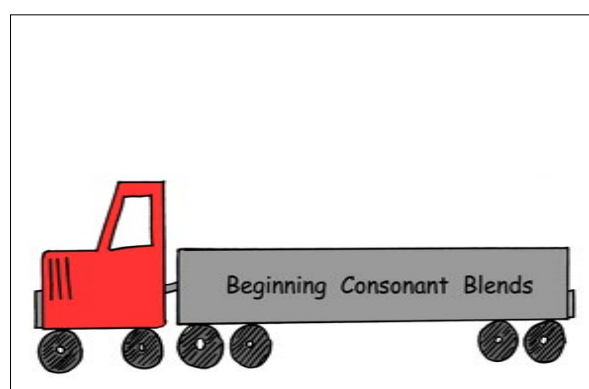


Beginning Blend Truck Chart - Use With All Books 1-8

Add three new dotted vowel charts: dotted a, dotted o, and dotted u. Add only the top part of the dotted a chart. Cut along the top of the dotted o chart to separate it from the extra dotted a patterns shown above it. Trim the extra white paper from the bottom of the extra dotted a patterns. Save it until you get to Book 8. Cut along the top of the dotted u chart to separate it from the dotted i chart. Save the dotted i chart until you get to Book 6.



Place the dotted a, dotted o, and dotted u charts side by side, leaving space for the dotted e and dotted i patterns to be added later.
